God, in His sovereignty, does not exempt His children from the war. The question then is not whether you want to Be involved—but rather, when I become involved, will I be ready?

### **GOD'S SOVEREIGNTY VS. SATAN'S FREEDOM**

Sovereignty: supreme excellence or an example of it; a supreme power (especially of a body); freedom from external control.

Belief #1: You believe Satan is completely free to attack at will, then you will expect constant attacks with no greater purpose than Satan's attempts to hinder the will of God and personally destroy you.

Belief #2: You believe God is sovereign, then you will assume that Satan had to first obtain permission, and God has a greater purpose in mind for the warfare.

### Implications of a Sovereign God

- 1. God has a greater purpose in spiritual warfare.
- 2. The focus would be on God, not Satan, in the midst of the attack.
- 3. The confidence for victory depends on God, not me and my performance.
- 4. The standard of evaluating success depends on whether or not God accomplished His purposes through my life.

### Implications of an Unsovereign God

- 1. There would be no purpose in spiritual warfare, only random attacks.
- 2. The focus would have to be on Satan and his plots and schemes instead of God's purposes.
- 3. The confidence for victory would depend on me and my performance.
- 4. The standard of evaluating success would depend on whether we were able to remove Satan.

### How Do I Respond to Temptation?

- 1. Run to God. When the devil wants you to enter into conversation with him, choose instead to talk to God.
- 2. Focus on God's goodness and blessings. When the devil entices you to see what you're missing, remember the blessings of God. Take time to think about all that God has done for you.
- 3. Remember the consequences of sin. The enemy makes sin look inviting, but the consequences are devastating. Think past the temporary pleasure to recognize the long-term pain of disobedience.
- 4. Be sure to thank God for protecting you when He has given you strength to defeat the enemy.

### THE ENEMY PROMOTES BITTERNESS AND ANGER

### Why is unforgiveness a matter of spiritual warfare?

- 1. Satan wants us to live disobediently, and unforgiveness is disobedience
- 2. Forgiving others is a mark of persons who have themselves been forgiven much.
- 3. Our witness through relationships is weakened when we choose not to forgive.

### How Do I Know if I Need to Forgive?

- Do I think often about the pain?
- Do I experience physical symptoms (stomach problems, lack of appetite, overeating, insomnia, and so forth) when I think of the pain?
- Do I want the person to hurt as I did before I offer forgiveness?
- Can I pray for the person?
- Will I rejoice if God blesses the person?

### How Do I Begin the Process of Forgiving?

- Ask two or three prayer partners to pray with you about the matter.
- Dwell on God's forgiveness of you.
- Remember that forgiving does not justify the wrong, nor does it give permission for the offender to hurt you again.
- Determine either to forgive or to be disobedient to God.
- Make the decision to forgive, regardless of any feelings. Pray for the other person
- Be accountable to your prayer partners.

### Here are some you may have heard:

- □ I told you that you would fall again
- God probably won't forgive you this time
- □ There's no way that God will ever use you again now
- □ You're so easy to deceive and mislead. You're not even a challenge anymore.
- □ You'll never overcome this sin. Why do you even try?

When we believe we cannot change, we stop trying to change—and the stronghold becomes apparent.

### The Development of a Stronghold:

- 1. We place ourselves in the way of temptation.
- 2. Satan entices us to give in to temptation.
- 3. We fail, and Satan strikes with accusations.
- 4. We listen to the accusations, assuming we cannot change.
- 5. We lose our hope.
- 6. Having lost our hope, we again place ourselves in the way of temptation—and lose the battles.

"We need to recognize how thinking processes influence this pattern. Temptations most often begin in the mind. Particularly if we have heard the past negative messages of poor self-worth, we might seek to hide those messages through the pleasure of sin. On the other hand, sometimes our ego sets us up for failure. In either case, we convince ourselves through our thought processes to succumb to the temptation. Satan accuses us again, and we hear his words of accusation in our minds. With no hope, we continually open our minds to further temptation—and, ultimately, to defeat."

### Is a Stronghold Developing?

- Has the sin become habitual? That is, do I continually commit the sin, even though I know that God is displeased?
- Have I given up fighting the sin? Am I close to saying, "What's the point of trying? I just can't overcome this sin"?
- Do I continue placing myself in the way of temptation? Though I know that temptation—and probably failure—await, do I still move in the devil's direction?
- With regard to my sin, is it hard for me to believe bible promises such as "When you are tempted, He will also provide a way out so that you can stand up under it" (1 Cor. 10:13)?
- Have I stopped spending time with God, reading His Word and praying, because I am so overwhelmed by the guilt of my sin?

### 1 John 1:9 Amplified

If we freely admit that we have sinned and confess our sins, He is faithful and just (true to His own nature and promises) and will forgive our sins [dismiss our lawlessness] and [continuously] cleanse us from all unrighteousness [everything not in conformity to His will in purpose, thought, and action.].

### Why Memorizing the Word Is Important:

- \* Hiding His Word in our hearts helps us to guard against sin (Ps.119:11)
- \* Knowing His Word helps us to think about things that are honoring to God (Phil.4:8)
- \* The Word, quoted out of a life of holiness, causes the devil to flee (Luke 4:13)
- \* The truth sets us free (John 8:32)
- \* What we put into our minds affects how we live
- \* We don't always have access to a Bible when we face spiritual attacks
- \* Even when we have access to a Bible, we can't always immediately locate the texts
